The gift of life is precious to God and we give thanks with you on the birth/adoption of your son/daughter. We want this to be a meaningful time for you and your family.

Before any date is set, the pastor will ask to meet with you, especially if he/she doesn't know you and/or this is your first child. During that meeting the pastor will review our beliefs about the Sacrament of Baptism. Non-members of Immanuel may receive Baptism if they are regular worshipers.

What Is Baptism?

The following is a list of what baptism is And why we Lutherans (and other denominations) baptize children

1. We surround a child with love. Baptism is a sacrament in which God gives grace to be a child of the kingdom.

2. A child is God's creation, God's child

3. Parents are not enough. A child belongs to a community, a people of faith, who share a history and offer support. That is why baptism generally occurs during the worship service.

4. Baptism ushers a child into the story of God's love revealed in Jesus.

The Vows

You and your Sponsor(s) will promise to raise your child in the Christian faith and the Christian community. Your promise will be a response to the Good News of faith in Christ. In the ELW (red hymnal) your promises are to:

- Live with your son/daughter among God's faithful people,
- Bring them to the word of God and the holy supper,
- ❖ Teach them the Lord's Prayer, the Creed and the Ten Commandments,
 - Place in their hands the Holy Scriptures, and
 - Nurture them in faith and prayer.

Our prayer at Immanuel is what Jesus taught us in the Bible, Mark 10: "Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them; for to such belongs the kingdom of God".
